## Talmudic Ethics

Regarding bloodshed, the following distinction applies: If a non-Jew killed another non-Jew, or a non-Jew killed a Jew, the killer is liable for execution; if a Jew killed a non-Jew, he is exempt from punishment.

Babylonian Talmud, Sanhedrin 57a

The property of Gentiles can be stolen by Jews.<sup>1</sup>

Jews can commit adultery with the wife of a Gentile.<sup>2</sup>

If a Gentile hits a Jew he is worthy of death.<sup>3</sup>

Gentile children are subhuman.<sup>4</sup>

Gentiles are not only subhuman but are completely evil, a different species.<sup>5</sup>

Jehovah created the non-Jew in human form so that the Jew would not be served by beasts. The non-Jew is consequently an animal in human form, and condemned to serve the Jew day and night.<sup>6</sup>

You (Jews) are human beings but the nations of the world are not human beings, but beasts.<sup>7</sup>

Even the best of the Gentiles should be killed.<sup>8</sup>

Smiting a Jew on the jaw is like assaulting the 'Divine Presence'.<sup>9</sup>

All Jews are good; all Gentiles are evil.<sup>10</sup>

He who desires that none of his vows made during the year shall be valid, let him stand at the beginning of the year, and declare 'every vow which I make in the future shall be null'. His vows are then invalid provided that he remembers this at the time of the vow.<sup>11</sup> [The *Kol Nidre* vow to enable Jews to lie and commit perjury]
